
03. Discuss what you think are different characteristics of a spiritually defining moment. Share a spiritually defining moment from your own life. How has the outcome of that moment affected your life?

02. Read James 2:14-18. Can you think of a time when your faith was merely a religious experience? How do you think this passage from James applies?


03. How would you respond to the statement, "God resupplies according to the measure of our faith"?


03. King David missed God's heart the first time, but found it the next time. What do you think made the difference? Have you ever had a similar experience?

03. Read Luke 21:1-4. Discuss the idea that giving generously isn't about the amount, it's about the sacrifice.


02. On the flip side, what would prevent you from making a willing, personal sacrifice?
