
Our commitment to helping people **find hope** in Jesus and take their next right steps of faith is unwavering, yet our approach is continuously evolving.

1 OUT PURPOSE

3	We can also be generous with our words, as described in Ephesians 4:29. How often do you consciously think about the impact of your words before speaking? How can you ensure your speech builds others up?

Proverbs 11:24-25 describes how generosity enriches us. How
have you experienced the truth of "whoever brings blessing will
be enriched" in your life? In what ways has generosity led to
unexpected blessings for you or others?
God calls us to be encouragers in 1 Thessalonians 5:11. How
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intentional are you about generously encouraging others?

1	In 1 Peter 4:10, we are called to steward the gifts we've been given. Are you aware of the needs of those around you? How can you align your gifts to meet those needs, reflecting God's grace and love?
2	Jesus reminds us in Mark 10:45 that He came to serve others. Are you more focused on being served or on serving others in your relationships, workplace, and community? How can you shift your mindset?
3	Philippians 2:3-4 encourages us to serve with humility. What steps can you take to prioritize the well-being and interests of others in your daily interactions, whether at home, work, or in the community?

4	As we read in Matthew 25:35-36, serving others is serving Jesus. How does your lifestyle reflect this kind of compassion and service? Are there specific things you can do to serve others as if you were serving Christ Himself?
5	In Galatians 5:13, God calls us to use our freedom to serve others. How can you cultivate a heart of service that reflects the love of Christ, especially when serving others might require personal sacrifice or discomfort?

2	Our role in sharing the gospel is critical, as we read in Romans 10:13-14. Does your life reflect a commitment to helping others know God? How can you more intentionally share with those who have not yet heard or understood?
3	Jesus told His disciples to be "fishers of men" in Matthew 4:19-20. In what ways are you actively participating in this mission? How can you be more intentional about making disciples?

In Luke 19:10, Jesus says He came to save the lost. Is the urgency of His mission shaping your priorities and decisions? How can
you better align your life with His purpose of reaching those far
from God?
Matthew 28:19-20 is known as the Great Commission. Where in
your life might God be calling you to step out of your comfort
zone to fulfill this mission? Are there specific people or places
He is prompting you to reach with the gospel?
