Part Two: Jesus, Friend of Sinners

Introduction

Jesus faced all of the same feelings, emotions and temptations that we do, and yet He lived a perfect life. Jesus saw a man named Matthew, a tax collector, and said to him, "Follow me." While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with Him and His disciples. (Matthew 9:9-13) Jesus was confronted with a woman who was caught in the act of adultery by the Pharisees. Jesus bent down with compassion and said, "Then neither do I condemn you, go now and leave your life of sin." (John 8:1-11)

Discussion Questions

- 1. It is recorded and evident in the four gospels that Jesus hung out with sinners. When you reflect on the attitude and actions of Jesus, why did the Pharisees have a problem with Jesus' lifestyle, being a friend of sinners? What observations or conclusions come to mind when Scripture describes Jesus as a friend of sinners?
- 2. Why is it important to clarify Jesus pursuing Matthew (Matthew 9:9-13)? Why did Jesus not condemn the woman caught in the act of adultery but said, "go and sin no more" (John 8:1-11)? Can you identify and share an experience where you or someone else has been pursued by Christ? Forgiven by Christ?
- 3. Having a "Matthew Party" is a very intriguing idea. What do you remember Pastor Jared sharing about a "Matthew Party"? Are you interested in throwing a "Matthew Party"? Does this intimidate you or energize you? Who would be on your invite list? How would you feel as an unbeliever to be on the invite list for a "Matthew Party"? As a follower of Christ are you intentional about including unbelievers in your daily life?
- 4. Define being "grace-driven" and "truth-led." Discuss how we as a church (followers of Christ) can become more effective in reaching out to others in this way. How can we effectively balance being "in the world, but not of the world"?
- 5. Are you more like Jesus or the Pharisees in your attitudes and actions? Why?
- 6. Do you see others through the eyes of Jesus? Who is God calling you to reach out to as a friend?
