READ ACTS 2:45-47

What would you say was the purpose of the early church in Jerusalem? How was that purpose apparent to those on the outside who were watching them?

GUIDANCE

One aspect of purpose was their gathering together as a redeemed community of people devoted to following Jesus. Their gathering was joyful and generous. They cared for one another in practical ways. Their focus was in praising God for all he had done for them. Those who were watching from the outside had to have seen the genuineness of their faith and their loving relationships. Who among us would not want to join a community such as this? And apparently many people were drawn to the community and were being saved as God moved in their hearts.

READ MATTHEW 28:19-20

What are some ways the command (Great Commission) might have affected the behaviors and lifestyles of the early church? How does that command relate today to Fairhaven Church in Dayton?

GUIDANCE

The Great Commission motivated the early believers to hold their possessions with open hands, and be willing to share what they had with anyone who had need. In order to do that one must appreciate that the rewards in this life (e.g. money and possessions) are not worthy to be compared to the rewards in the next life. They were willing to lead a sacrificial life, understanding that they were strangers and aliens in this world (*IPet. 2:11; Heb. 11:13*).

READ EPHESIANS 5:25-27

How does Paul describe Jesus' love for the Church? In what way is the Church sanctified or "holy and without blemish"? Do you think these verses still describe Jesus' love for the Church? How might this relate to giving us a purpose to live for?

GUIDANCE

Jesus' love for the Church was sacrificial. He gave himself in willing sacrifice to sanctify and make holy a people gathered for his namesake. He has provided everything the Church needs so that we can be presented before him without spot or wrinkle. Only through the precious sacrifice of Jesus' blood can we ever hope to be holy and without blemish. The mission of Jesus is still ours: to reach people for Jesus and gather them into loving and growing churches. It's an eternal purpose, and is worthy of our devotion.

READ EPHESIANS 4:11-14

How does Ephesians 4:11-14 relate to God's purpose in the Church? How might that purpose relate to you?

GUIDANCE

This passage helps us to see that God is always at work within his Church to help people grow to maturity in their faith in Jesus. He wants to use the Church to reach and disciple others with the intent that we would be stable in our faith and fruitful in our service to God.
