### **INTRODUCTION (5-10 MINUTES)**

### INTO THE WORD (20 MINUTES)

**Read 2 Peter 3:1-2, 11-13 and 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6.** How do these passages instruct us to live in view of Jesus' Second Coming? What do you find most appealing about the doctrine of Jesus' Second Coming?

**Host Guidance:** These passages instruct us to live with vigilance, holiness, and expectation. We should be alert and sober, prioritizing godly living while eagerly anticipating Jesus' return. The doctrine of Jesus' Second Coming is appealing because it offers hope, a promise of ultimate justice, and the fulfillment of God's redemptive plan.

**Read 2 Peter 3:5-7 and 1 Thessalonians 4:17.** How should these verses inspire hope, peace and confidence in us as we look toward the future?

**Host Guidance:** These verses inspire hope, peace, and confidence by reminding us of God's control over creation and His promise of eternal life with Him. 2 Peter 3:5-7 reassures us of God's sovereign plan, while 1 Thessalonians 4:17 offers the comforting promise that believers will be with the Lord forever.

How does it encourage you today to know that God has had you in His heart from eternity past (Psalm 139, Jeremiah 1:5), and will have you in His heart for all eternity future?

**Host Guidance:** Knowing that God has had us in His heart from eternity past and will have us in His heart for all eternity future brings profound encouragement. It reassures us of His constant love and intentionality in our lives. This eternal perspective provides comfort, purpose, and confidence, affirming that we are cherished and secure in His everlasting care.

**Read 2 Peter 3:8-9 and Romans 2:4.** What do these verses teach regarding God's patience? How have you experienced God's patience and forbearance?

**Host Guidance:** They teach us that God's patience demonstrates His mercy and desire for repentance. God's delay in judgment is not neglect but an opportunity for salvation. Personally, perhaps you've experienced God's patience in times of repeated mistakes, where instead of immediate consequence, He offers grace and time to change.

**Read 2 Peter 3:9, 1 Corinthians 5:18-20, and 1 Timothy 2:4.** How do these verses shed light on what God is doing in this age, and what we should be doing in this age?

**Host Guidance:** These verses reveal that God is actively working to bring people to repentance and reconciliation with Him. He desires all to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth. In this age, we should be ambassadors for Christ, sharing the message of reconciliation, living out our faith, and praying for the salvation of others.

What does it look like for us to live as "ambassadors of Christ"?
