No skills or supplies are required! All supplies are provided by CAP and teams will serve under the direction of a skilled crew leader. Our teams will primarily be assisting the Housing and Elderly Services programs. Projects may include, but are not limited to, remodeling an existing home by painting, repairing the floors and walls, hanging dry walls, replacing doors and windows, putting up vinyl siding, yard work, cleaning, or building wheelchair ramps.

Necessary Skills: Nothing required but a willing heart! All supplies & training are provided.

Meals: Breakfast and supper will be served at the Mission Center. We will pack our own sack lunches to take to the job site each day.

TENTATIVE TRIP SCHEDULE
